The Marshall SWCD will carry out:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Landowner outreach and information - Provide technical assistance to landowners - Potentially provide financial assistance to landowners - Purchase of equipment to support implementation - Provide alternative practice validations, if requested, where the prescribed buffer may not be the right water quality practice for a site - Review DNR maps and conduct landowner outreach prior to map finalization - Potentially adopt buffer recommendations for waters not mapped by DNR for inclusion in local water management plans - Implement the new statewide excessive soil erosion provisions that protect downstream waters and property owners from negligent or absent soil and water conservation management practices - Inventory of baseline conditions i.e. where buffers already exist
